This will be a time for you to meet your child's new teacher and to ask any general questions which might not have been covered in the short presentation that the teachers will give. This will not be a time for individual discussions about settling in or progress. We are aware that some of you will have children in different classes and we are hoping that you will work together to disseminate important information for parents who are unable to attend.

**PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCY**- We have a vacancy for a parent governor to join our school's governing body. This is an opportunity to play a vital role in school life and to support different aspects of school organisation. **SWIMMING** – <u>Year 5</u> will be swimming at AHS at the beginning of the Autumn Term starting on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> of September. Please make sure that the children have their full kit with them, including a swimming hat, every Monday until half term.

**E-SAFETY AND WHATSAPP GROUPS**- All of the children will be learning about E-Safety in their IT lessons this half term. They will learn how to keep themselves safe on line and how to address issues such as cyber bullying. Just a reminder that the age limit for use of Whatsapp is 16yrs, TikTok is 13yrs and Instagram is also 13 years. Should parents and carers decide to override these legal limits and allow their children to use these sites then the responsibility for the children's behaviour on them will fall with the parents.

**LEARNING SUPPORT CAFÉ** – Mrs Gale will be holding Learning Support Cafes on the second Wednesday of each month. Parents and carers are invited to come along to chat about any concerns they have relating to children's learning needs. Mrs Gale will be in the dining room from 2.15p.m. to 3.00p.m. to discuss any general concerns. We hope that parents and carers will use this opportunity to support and discuss issues with each other.

**AFTER SCHOOL CLUB GAMES** – After School Club are looking for any donations of board games or jigsaws. We have plenty of games for younger children and lots of Disney jigsaws, but we would really love anything, games or jigsaws, that you have which are a bit more challenging – we have a clever lot at Aldborough who love a challenge! **JEWELLERY AND HAIR** - The only jewellery allowed in school is one pair of stud earrings, which need to be taped up for PE. For your child's comfort and hygiene please ensure that all long hair is tied up every day. Long hair in children's faces (boys and girls) has a significant impact on their learning.

**SCHOOL LUNCHES** – From September the cost of a school lunch has risen to £2.50. We are very sorry that we have had to make this change, but we are also dealing with rising prices and raised energy bills. Just a reminder for year 2 parents (year 3 Sept 2023) that all lunches in KS2 have to be paid for using school accounts. Universal Free School Meals come to an end at the end of KS1.

**KEY STAGE 2 SNACKS** – We will no long be providing snacks for children in Key Stage 2. Key Stage 1 snacks will continue to be provided for all children in C1 and C2.

**SCHOOL ACCOUNTS –** Please keep your school accounts settled and up to date, thank you.

**ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL -** If your child is absent from school, please call the office number 01263 761264 at the earliest opportunity and leave a message. Please call each day of your child's absence, giving your child's name and reason. Please do not email, although we appreciate it can be easier for you to quickly do this, we cannot guarantee that the email has been received and therefore your child would be registered as 'Missing in Education', which then prompts Safeguarding measures to be taken. **Attendance is reviewed regularly. ATTENDANCE AT LESS THAN 90% WILL INSTIGATE ATTENDANCE INTERVENTION**

**MEDICATION IN SCHOOL** – Parents and carers are reminded that any medicine that comes to school must be handed in to the school office and the appropriate paper work must be completed. Please ensure that all prescription medication is in the original pharmacy container/packaging, which includes the child's name and the necessary dosage/instructions. If prescription medicines do not have this information then school staff are unable to administer the medication.

SCHOOL WEBSITE – We are continually updating our school website to include information about the children's learning in each term and in each class. Please do familiarise yourself with the website as it provides lots of information about the curriculum. We are often asked to provide work for children who are going on holiday during term time. This is not something that we do due to the pressure that it puts on teacher workload in addition to the additional workload involved with helping the children to catch up when they return to school. The website is an excellent source of information for those parents who wish their children to work during term time holidays. **HEALTHY SNACKS, LUNCHES AND BIRTHDAY TREATS** – Please ensure that the snacks and packed lunches that the children bring to school are healthy and nut free. We work very hard as a school to support health and well-being and the contents of some lunch boxes make consistent messages difficult for the children to understand. It would be much appreciated if birthday treats, which are shared with the class, are also sugar free and consistent with children's health and well-being. Please avoid sugary lollipops in particular. Thank you for your continued support in this matter.

**PE KIT** - Children need their PE kit in school at all times. It should not be taken home at the end of the week. PE kit is a white T-shirt, black or navy shorts and black or navy track suit bottoms/leggings and trainers. The children should wear a sweat shirt for outdoor PE. As always, the health and well-being of the children is our number one priority. Please ensure that the children have their PE kit in school with them at all times.

**JEWELLERY AND HAIR** - The only jewellery allowed in school is one pair of stud earrings, which need to be taped up for PE. No other jewellery is allowed. For your child's comfort and hygiene please ensure that all long hair is tied up every day.

**SUMMER CLOTHES** – Please could all families ensure that summer clothes are appropriate for the age of the children and activities at school. We know that children like to look fashionable, however, 'belly tops' and 'hot pants' are not conducive with a comfortable day at school, nor are shoulder-less tops which restrict movement. Nail varnish has never been allowed at school and nor has jewellery other than one pair of stud earrings.

**SANDALS AND SOCKS** - Just a quick reminder that the children are not allowed to wear open toed sandals for school unless they also wear socks.

**MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT** – Aldborough Primary has 3 'Mental Health First Responders' on site to help members of our community should they have a need. 
