Dear Friends.

There are tadpoles in Class 1! Who knew that such tiny creatures could create so many moments of awe and wonder for the children? It is impossible to go into C1 without being told exciting information about the life cycle of the tadpoles and the way they behave during the day. The children are all learning in fascinating way. Some of them sit quietly and watch the tadpoles, others want to ask lots and lots (and lots and lots) of questions. Some draw the tadpoles and others wiggle and swim their way around the classroom clearly 'being' a tadpole! Whether it is The Bog Baby in Class 2, bread making in Class 3, fighting the Anglo-Saxons in Class 4 or angles in a triangle in Class 5, we see these differences in the way the children learn every day. THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE – Thank you to all parents and carers for your patience as we battled broken phone lines, poor internet access and payment issues. Fingers crossed we are all up and running again now. If you are still having problems making payment please contact the office.

SNACKS – Children in C1 and C2 should not bring their own snacks into school unless this has been agreed with the Office. All children in these classes are provided with a free snack by the kitchen (all homemade by Tracy and Kerry) and we are increasingly throwing food away as children bring in snacks in from home. Should you feel that there is a medical reason why your child needs to bring in their own snack please discuss this with the office.

FAMILY LEARNING AFTERNOON – Our next Family Learning Afternoon is "**THE GREAT ALDBOROUGH OLYMPIC PENTATHLON**". Those of you who have been at the school for a number of years will know that we hold this sponsored event every two years and it is our major fund raiser for school fund. The money raised in 2022 has paid for all the reading books that the classes have as their class readers (generally 15 copies of a book each half term per class). Without the money raised through the pentathlon we would have struggled to provide the classes with this essential resource. All the information that you need to help the children to take part will be with you at the end of next week. We hope that as many of you as possible will join us to take the children around the course on **Tuesday 21**st **May from 1.45 p.m. – 3.00 p.m.**

YEAR 6 DATE FOR YOUR DIARY- On Monday June 17th the pastoral team from Aylsham High School will be leading a workshop for parents/carers and children in year 6 to support the children in their transition to high school. The workshop is for all year 6 children regardless of which secondary school they are moving on to. The workshop will start immediately after school at 3.15 p.m. and run for about an hour. There will be separate advice and guidance for parents/carers and children. We really hope that you will all be able to attend this important session.

TRANSITION DAYS – Now that the year 6 children have been allocated their school places for September some of the secondary schools have given us the dates for their transition days. The year 6 children who have been allocated places at Aylsham High School will visit on Wed 26th June, Thurs 27th June and Friday 28th June. The year 6 children who have allocated places at North Walsham High School will visit on Monday 1st July and Tuesday 2nd July. **PLEASE AVOID BOOKING ANY DAYS OFF SCHOOL AT THIS IMPORTANT TIME.** The secondary schools will be in touch with parents/carers directly with further information. **OUR WHOLE SCHOOL TRANSITION DAY WILL BE ON THURSDAY 27TH JUNE.**

SCHOOL CLOTHES – As promised, there is advice for appropriate school clothes for September on our school website. This is based on the feedback that we had from parents earlier this year and the behaviour that we observe in school on a daily basis. ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL - If your child is absent from school, please call the office number 01263 761264 at the earliest opportunity and leave a message. Please call each day of your child's absence, giving your child's name and reason. Please do not email, although we appreciate it can be easier for you to quickly do this, we cannot guarantee that the email has been received and therefore your child would be registered as 'Missing in Education', which then prompts Safeguarding measures to be taken. **Attendance is reviewed regularly. ATTENDANCE AT LESS THAN 90% WILL INSTIGATE ATTENDANCE INTERVENTION**

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL – Parents and carers are reminded that any medicine that comes to school must be handed in to the school office and the appropriate paper work must be completed. Please ensure that all prescription medication is in the original pharmacy container/packaging, which includes the child's name and the necessary dosage/instructions. If prescription medicines do not have this information then school staff are unable to administer the medication.
